(Board approved December 18, 2019)

These stories of freedom and equality, injustice and struggle, loss and achievement, and courage and triumph shape people's personal values that guide them through life.¹

Living History Farms welcomes diverse opinions and voices with our interpretive experiences. We believe this culture of inclusion supports our mission to educate, entertain and enrich all our guests and better serve the community.

Like the beautifully woven historic quilts in our collection, Living History farms staff, volunteers, interns and guests are people from diverse backgrounds, upbringings and experiences, each of whom brings their uniqueness to our museum, making it the best visitor experience possible. We are truly greater than the sum of our parts, together.

In 2019, Living History Farms was accepted into an annual cohort of the Cultural Competence Learning Institute (CCLI) with 6 other museums from around the country. The cohort is "a process and a set of resources designed to help museums increase organizational capacity around diversity, inclusion, and culture." Living History Farms is the first museum in Iowa to participate in this program and the first outdoor history museum in the country to do so.

We are very enthusiastic about our participation because we have much to learn on these topics from one another. We understand that this is a very personal journey for all of us and one that never ends.

We strive to be a museum that is welcoming to all and that shares the many different stories of Midwest rural life experiences. We want to be a convener of community conversations about those stories. We hope you will join us on this journey by sharing your stories and listening to the stories of others.

We extend our heartfelt sympathies to the Floyd family and all of the people in our community who have experienced inexcusable racism and violence. The social unrest resulting from the injustices we have recently witnessed is more than uncomfortable. It is also an ingredient in
